

Château Saint Martial

Saint-Emilion Grand Cru

*A fine, luscious and easy to drink wine with oodles of ripe red fruit intertwined with spices and mellow tannins
To taste at 17-18° over steaks, cooked poultry and mild cow cheeses.*

HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION: The estate, located on the banks of the Dordogne river near the city of Saint Emilion was founded by the family Dupeyrat and is now run by the family Micheau Maillou. The label represents the menhir of Saint Martial, a 15-foot-spatula-like-megalite from the end of the Neolithic age, which has a hole for offerings.

VINEYARD AREA: 3,70 hectares

SOIL: sandy-gravelly

GRAPE VARIETALS: 80% Merlot – 20% Cabernet Franc

Average age of the vines: 45 years old

WORK IN THE VINEYARD: desbudding, deleafing, green harvests

HARVESTING: mechanical at full ripeness

VINIFICATION: in thermoregulated stainless steel vats – A 3-week maceration

AGEING: two third of the quantity is aged in barrels out of which one third is new and the rest is aged in vats

PRODUCTION: 20,000 bottles per year
